

The festival of Rakhi is right around the corner, and siblings everywhere are ready to mark this day with much excitement. Raksha Bandhan is a festival which celebrates the bond of a brother and sister. This festival is celebrated in the Hindu religion. But it would be wrong to say that the festival is celebrated only among the Hindus in the present time. It is a festival honouring the special bond of love and brotherhood shared between siblings

irrespective of any caste, creed and religion. Sisters tie sacred threads to the wrist of their brothers, thereby reminding them of their great responsibility. All over India, Sisters whether they are married or unmarried, young or old visit their brothers and tie a piece of decorative thread and in return Brothers make a vow to protect their sisters from all evil. Siblings also exchange special gifts on this day, with brother pampering sisters with their favourite things.

The word 'Raksha Bandhan' has a very significant meaning. Raksha means protection and Bandhan means bond. It is the celebration of a chaste bond of love and protection between a brother and Sister. As per Hindu mythology - in Mahabharat - Lord Krishna accidentally cut his finger on the Sudarshan Chakra. Seeing this, Princess Draupadi tied a piece of cloth to prevent blood loss. Lord Krishna was deeply touched by her gesture, and in return, promised to take care of her from all evils in the world. During Draupadi's chirharan, when the Kauravas tried to shame and belittle her, Lord Krishna kept his promise by protecting her from dishonour and humiliation. During the British rule, this Festival was celebrated to promote friendship and unity among all communities. Rabindranath Tagore also sought the medium of Rakhi to stop the partition of Bengal.

Raksha Bandhan is celebrated following the Hindu calendar. It falls in the month of Saawan and people celebrate it on the last day of the month. This auspicious festival usually falls around August only. Some people call this Festival 'Rakhi Purnima', some call it 'Kajri Purnima'. In many states, this Festival is considered as an important day for farmers and



women who have sons. On this occasion, people worship Lord Shiva. As per the tradition, the sisters prepare a thali or a plate with diya, roli, rice and Rakhis. Sisters put tilak on their brother's forehead, tie a Rakhi around the wrist, eat sweets, and exchange gifts on this day. This year, Raksha Bandhan will fall on August 11 and 12. Drik Panchang says that the Saawan Purnima tithi will begin at 10:38 am on August 11 and end on 07:05 am on August 12, 2022.



The happiness and enthusiasm to celebrate this Festival is seen several days before the festival. The markets are full of beautiful coloured Rakhis. These days, it has become a soaring business. Many shopkeepers' sole business is buying and selling Rakhis. The markets are decked like a bride, all colourful and glory. There are varieties of Rakhis available in the market ranging from low to high. However, prices do not matter as Raksha Bandhan is celebrated with someone who cares for you and always looks out for you, regardless of gender and

relations. For all families, the Raksha Bandhan Festival is a means of family union. Tasty food, sweets, etc. are cooked on this auspicious day. Family members also exchange Gifts with other good wishers and relatives and share their individual experiences of life. Nowadays, even sisters who do not have brothers celebrate Raksha Bandhan with their sisters. The essence of the festival remains the same nonetheless. Also, people gather together some place and celebrate the festival with each other even though they are not siblings.

E-NEWSLETTER - JULY EDITION INPUT SERVICE DISTRIBUTOR (ISD) Under GST

What is the procedure and timeline for registration as ISD?

- I. As such there is no specific procedure, we only need to select the reason of registration as an ISD in Form GST REG-01 for registration.
- II. It is preferred that the Input Service Registration should be taken in the name of Head Office.



III. There is no such specific timeline for registration as an ISD.

Appointment of Credit & Manner thereof

Input tax credit is required to be distributed to one of the recipients 'R1' whether registered or not, from amongst the total of all the recipients to whom ITC is attributable including those who supply the exempt supply.

 $C1 = (t1 / T) \times C$

"C" is the amount of credit to be distributed.

"t1" is the turnover of recipient.

"T" is the aggregate of the turnover, during the relevant period, of all recipients to whom the input service is attributable in accordance with the provisions of section 20.

Turnover of which period is to be considered?

Whether all the recipients of credit have turnover in in the financial year preceding the year during which credit is to be distributed?

- o Yes the said financial year; or
- o $\,$ No the last quarter for which details of such turnover of all the recipients are available, previous to the month during which credit is to be distributed;

Compliances post Registration – Special Requirements

Compliances post Registration - Specials Requirements

- I. Returns to be filed by ISD:
- a. ISD should file monthly returns in Form GSTR-6 within 13 days after the end of the month but it can only be filed after 10th of the month

II. Invoice to be issued by ISD:

Apart from general requirements of Invoice, there are some specific requirements in the Invoice to be issued by ISD.

- a. The ISD issuing invoice should clearly mention that the invoice is issued only for distribution of input tax credit.
 - b. The invoice raised by an ISD should contain the amount of the credit distributed.
- III. Invoice to be issued by Branch to the ISD:
- a. A Registered person having the same PAN and State Code as an ISD, may issue an Invoice / Debit Note / Credit Note to transfer the Credit of common input services to the ISD.

The Apart from general requirements of Invoice, there are some specific requirements in the Invoice to be issued by ISD.

- b. Invoice raised by the branch should contain the following:
- i. GSTIN of the supplier of common service and original invoice number whose credit is sought to be transferred to the ISD;
 - ii. taxable value, rate and amount of the credit to be transferred.

The taxable value in the invoice issued shall be the same as the value of the common services.

Are there any concern areas for an ISD registrant?

Yes, there are some concern areas for ISD Registrant:


- 1. Manner of Apportionment of Credit:
- i. Separate Distribution of Eligible & Ineligible Credit.
- ii. If any service is used for any specific branch, then the said credit is not to be distributed among all.
- 2. Payment of Tax under RCM pertaining to common expense:
- i. Invoice has to be received in that branch (which has the same PAN and State Code as an ISD).
- ii. The said branch will pay tax under RCM and raise an Invoice in the name of ISD by mentioning the GSTIN of the supplier of common service and original invoice number whose credit is sought to be transferred to the ISD.
- iii. ISD will distribute credit to all the branches by raising the separate Invoice to all the concerned branches.






